Over the course of the last 18 months, dozens of prospective families have visited Paul Penna DJDS and we will welcome up to 30 of those families in September. Jewish families have sought out our downtown Jewish school as they have run towards community, identity and Jewish education as part of a values re-examination in a post October 7th reality. The story of our growth over the past decade has resonated deeply with families and the four core pillars of our strategic plan have struck them as just right, for right now.

Families have been drawn to the **cultivation of joyful and rigorous academics**; connecting to engaging and accelerated curriculum and support for the whole student. Our **healthy, secure and inclusive community** is what families are looking for; drawn to the way we step up with a commitment to volunteerism and parent involvement. Our commitment to **defining our permanent home** has led to the securing of 10,000 square feet for a new middle school space and significant investment in the elementary school space. Our school's commitment to **ensuring financial sustainability**  has made a positive impact; creating a student body that is diverse and strengthened by families and a wider community who have a deep desire to support the school and give children a Jewish education.

At the core of our school's mission is commitment to seven values: community, diversity, individuality, Israel, learning, place and social action. With these values at the centre, we are a strong and thriving school intent on deepening our impact on the Toronto Jewish community.

# **BY THE NUMBERS**





225 volunteers every school year, including 90% of school families, dozens of alumni students and many enthusiastic grandparents. Over \$400,000 raised to cover the gap between tuition and the cost to educate all our students, kindergarten to Grade 8, providing tuition support to over 25% of school families.



45 current and alumni families, grandparents and community members are donors to our newly established Leadership Circle Annual Campaign giving a level of gifts beginning at \$1,800. 235 students will attend our school next year - almost 100% capacity. The school has grown by over 40% in the last 5 years to meet the demand for an excellent downtown Jewish education. 75 extra curricular athletic, arts and academic programs, teams and clubs with 95% of our students participating in these skill building and wellness experiences. 110 unique programs each year welcoming parents, prospective families, connected generations, alumni and families into our school experiences. The Annual Campaign is at the centre of Paul Penna Downtown Jewish Day School's commitment to financial sustainability. Each year we raise over \$400,000 which enables the *DJDS Difference* - tuition subsidy and the experiences, programs, community and curriculum above and beyond what tuition covers. Annual Campaign gifts help make the school an exceptional home for all families to experience Jewish life and receive a rigorous and fulsome education.

More than 400 members of this community, including every family in the school, made a meaningful contribution to the 2024/25 Annual Campaign. Alumni students and families, members of the faculty, school grandparents and family members and our wider community joined current families to activate the *DJDS Difference* of upholding our values and keeping our school safe and strong. As we look towards the 2025/26 school year we aim to grow our campaign total and the group of wonderful people sustaining our increasing needs by at least 10 percent, surpassing \$440,000 and 450 gifts to the Annual Campaign.

# CAMPUS REVITALIZATION: OUR SCHOOL'S GROWTH

Since 2017, Paul Penna DJDS has seen a 65% increase in student enrolment. In order to meet the needs of our expanding school community and to safeguard our future as the heart of Jewish Education in downtown Toronto, campus revitalization has become a central strategic objective.



By September 2025, all of the elementary classrooms will have been refurbished and refreshed, creating an optimal classroom layout and the ability to utilize the classroom as a third teacher. This enhancement to the elementary learning space is the perfect way to begin a new chapter of our elementary school life; one that includes our first JK cohort.

In September 2021, our middle school opened with 31 students. By last September, we were proud to welcome 76 students. Growth like this requires a rethinking of learning space. In winter 2026, we will open the doors to a new state of the art middle school space, with 60% more space than our current location and only steps away from the MNjcc. This will be our perfect home. Transformational philanthropy, a strategic board and a group of hard working volunteers will make it possible for middle school students to learn in an environment that matches our educational approach and mirrors our values.

As we look towards the next decade, the future at Paul Penna DJDS is bright, and our school space will pave the way for exciting learning opportunities, a deep sense of belonging and the gathering place for community in our unique downtown location.

When the opportunity arose to volunteer and support the PPDJDS community, Olam is a core value in our family and within the PPDJDS community, contribute. # THE IMPORTANCE OF A LASTING LEGACY: OUR GRADUATING CLASSES LEAVE THEIR MARK

Since 2019, rising classes at Paul Penna DJDS have led by example, creating a legacy that will have impact long after the students and their families have become alumni.

With the inaugural Graduation Legacy Fund, established by the class of 2019, led by Karen Rosen and Mark Opashinov (Parents, '19/'26) to endow future tuition assistance needs, a vital tradition was born. Twenty five families contributed \$60,000 to start a fund whose purpose is to ensure that students will always have access to a Jewish education as the cost to educate rises and subsidy needs grow above and beyond Annual Campaign capacity. Subsequent graduating families' contributions and the proceeds from the school's 25th Anniversary Gala have almost tripled that fund in just over five years.

Partner funds established and grown by alumni families including the Harold Nashman z'l Fund. Martin Sable z'l Fund and the Stephen J. Roth z'l Fund have allowed our school to dream that down the road we could permanently endow the majority of subsidy needs. Paul Penna DJDS' portfolio of values aligned funds, also established by graduating classes. include Arts. Social Justice and Athletics and Wellness Endowments. The school is proud to be among a handful of Jewish Day Schools accepted to the first North American Endowment training institute setting a bold goal of raising \$1,000,000 toward endowment by 2028.

We are very happy to be able to give back to PPDJDS, which has been such a special place for our children. Our middle child will be graduating this year. When our family decided to return to Toronto earlier this year, our kids couldn't wait to rejoin their friends and the learning environment at PPDJDS. We hope that our donation can help the school continue to benefit other families in the future as much as it has our own."
