With our physical foundation secure, we continue to enrich our curriculum, expand our extracurricular offerings, and use this intentional space as a blueprint for future success.

Our annual campaign continues its upward trajectory, propelled by a growing number of Leadership Circle gifts. Delivering on Our Blueprint:

The Launch of Our Middle School Campus

A central pillar of our 2024 Strategic Plan, *Blueprint for our Future*, was Defining Our Permanent Home—a commitment to securing long-term premises that align our physical environment with our educational philosophy and core Jewish values. The 2025-26 school year saw this ambitious goal fully realized, transforming the fabric of our school community.

Led by the Board of Directors alongside dedicated volunteer and philanthropic leaders, we set out to ensure our entire campus, from JK to Grade 8, reflected the academic excellence on which we pride ourselves. Every square foot was intentionally designed to support our core programming and foster an inclusive, collaborative learning environment. The crown jewel of this vision is the construction of a purpose-built state of the art urban middle school space, steps from the corner of Bloor and Spadina.

This milestone was propelled by an extraordinary collective effort. Our professional and lay leadership engaged our entire community—parents, grandparents, faculty, alumni, and friends—to raise over \$3 million across more than thirty exemplary gifts, ranging from \$18,000 to over \$1,000,000.

The excitement throughout this journey was palpable. Since the fall of 2025, over 150 community members have toured the space, watching it evolve from a bustling

construction site into a thriving extension of our campus. The ultimate reward came in January 2026, when 75 middle school students and 12 faculty members officially moved into their new home, infusing the space with immediate energy, gratitude, and academic rigor for the second half of the year.

Elementary School

Renamed and Refreshed

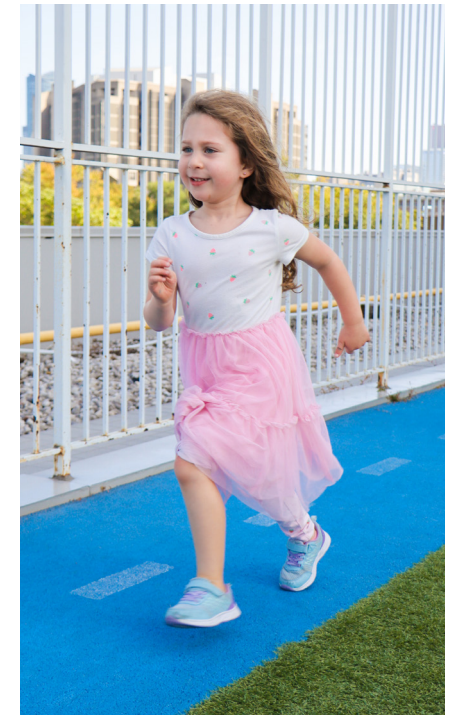
In 1998, the Downtown Jewish Day School opened with 10 students and 3 faculty members. As legend has it, the entire school population could take the elevator to the roof together to play on what was then a concrete pad. Over the past 28 years, Paul Penna DJDS has flourished to 10 grades and almost 240 students while remaining firmly rooted in the founding values of community and academic excellence.

Alongside our community growth, we have invested significantly in our physical space. This spring saw the completion of a two-year update and revitalization of our lower school, changing the face of learning for our kindergarten to grade 5 students including our first junior kindergarten class. With a transformative gift, Daphne Wagner and David Green have opened the Brenda Enchin z”l Elementary School at Paul Penna DJDS in honour of the school’s founding Hebrew teacher. In our hallways, the educational legacy of Morah Bracha lives on, filling our school with the joy and Jewish pride that is our community’s heartbeat.

In 2023, the school turned twenty five, inspiring leaders and donors from two and a half decades of school to honour the school’s legacy and future.

In the years following our Chai anniversary, we invested significantly in school spaces; building and refreshing our elementary school library, restoring and revitalizing the MNjcc chapel, as well as transforming the roof into the vibrant Wendy and Elliot Eisen outdoor play space. In total, through the partnership and support of our donors we have invested over a half a million dollars in our physical spaces to create an environment where the children experience the joy of Jewish learning and the members of our community come together.







Graduation Legacy and Leadership

At Paul Penna DJDS, graduation is not an ending, it is the beginning of lifelong engagement with our community. The Class of 2026, the first to graduate from our new campus, leaves a remarkable legacy through more than 40 gifts totaling over \$50,000 directed to the newly established Middle School Space Endowment Fund.

Throughout their journey, students grew into confident, capable graduates through experiences that nurtured leadership, responsibility, and purpose. Through rigorous academics and enriched Jewish learning, they developed as critical

thinkers and engaged learners. Through Tikkun Olam initiatives, they cultivated compassion and a commitment to community. As Madrichim, they learned to lead by example, and serve as ambassadors for the school, supporting events and contributing to our CAIS re-accreditation process. Through athletics and the arts, including leading the school musical, students developed teamwork, resilience, creativity, and professionalism.

Even after graduation, our alumni remain connected, returning as volunteers, mentors, and valued members of the PPDJDS family.
